

## The Bike Station, at the Shasta Bike Depot

The Shasta Bike Depot is home to Redding's first fully secured public parking exclusively for bicycles. It is located at 1322 California Street, next to the Downtown Transit Center, and is operated by Shasta Living Streets. The Shasta Bike Depot opens May 12, 2023.

The Shasta Bike Depot is part of the \$111 million mixed-use housing, commercial space and transportation project under construction along California Street. The project, which also includes partial operating funds for Redding Bikeshare, received \$20 million in grant funding from a state program to reduce greenhouse gas emissions through investments in transportation, affordable housing, urban greening and community programs.

Redding Bikeshare also received a \$1.5 million grant for staffing and equipment from the Clean Mobility Options Voucher Pilot Program (CMO), a statewide initiative that provides funding for zero-emission shared mobility options to under-resourced communities in California.

### The Bike Station at the Shasta Bike Depot

**Capacity:** 26 bikes, including adult and kid's bikes.

Parking is accessible 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. Bikes can be parked for up to 10 days.

**Price:** 5¢ per hour (or fraction of an hour). Payment is made through the BikeLink card and smartphone app. BikeLink cards can be purchased at the Shasta Bike Depot. BikeLink provides access to secure bike parking at more than 450 locations throughout the U.S.

**Security features:** The Shasta Bike Depot parking is located within a locked, interior room accessible using the BikeLink card or app. Depot users use their own locks to secure their bikes. The entire parking area is under 24/7 video surveillance.

### Key concepts

- Bike Station parking enables more people to make trips by bike to downtown Redding by making bike parking convenient and secure.
- Bike Station parking is inexpensive when compared to paid car parking, which costs \$1 per hour on downtown streets and in public lots during weekday business hours.
- Bike Station parking is the most secure type of public bike parking. It eliminates the worry of parking a valuable bike on the street, especially at night.
- Bike Station parking is a convenient and affordable parking option for downtown workers who don't have secure bike parking at their workplace.



- Bike Station parking helps extend the reach of Redding's public transit system, enabling longer trips without driving. People on bikes can park at the Shasta Bike Depot and transfer at the Downtown Transit Center to a RABA (Redding Area Bus Authority), Sage Stage (serving Modoc County), Trinity Transit (serving Trinity County), Greyhound or Amtrak Thruway bus or Amtrak's Coast Starlight train.
- The Shasta Bike Depot is located along more than 2 miles of protected bike lanes planned for city streets that will connect downtown Redding and surrounding neighborhoods with the Sacramento River Trail.

We use photo ID verification for additional security to access these shared use facilities. Takes about 3 minutes.

### 3. Park Your Bike



#### Insert card or Check-in with app.

Follow on-screen instructions to unlock door. Check door closes after you enter and exit.



#### Lock your bike.

Use your own locks to secure your bike. Take easily removed items, like lights, with you.



#### Display BikeLink number on your bike.

Use sticker that came with your card or attach a hang-tag provided in room.

Lock both wheels and frame. Take easily removed items, like lights, with you.

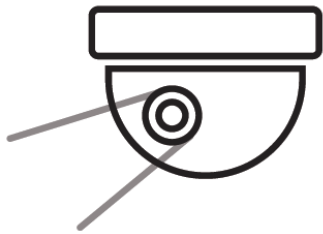


## Do not allow others to enter
