NEW California Street Bikeways are Complete Extending a Trail-Like experience in and out of Downtown Redding

Let's Celebrate! Friday October 3rd

The City of Redding and Caltrans District 2 have completed the protected bikeway that extends four blocks of California Street, past the Shasta Bike Depot and the Downtown Transit Center, into the heart of Downtown Redding.

With this section completed, the connected city-street protected bike lanes make up more than half of a 5-mile loop through Downtown and along the Sacramento River Trail. See the attached Fact Sheet for more details.

Caltrans District 2 is proud to have been a partner in helping to make the California Cycle Track a reality, building upon the bike lanes originally installed on this state route by Caltrans years ago. Those lanes were a first for Redding at the time, and this new enhancement marks another major milestone in the city's and Caltrans' ongoing commitment to multimodal transportation.
